# 71. PAY OFF

- **Meaning:**

1. To pay back money that you owe
2. To yield good results

- **Sentence:**

1. This year, I paid off all of my debt.
2. I am happy your hard work is paying off.

# 72. GO OFF

- **Meaning:**

1. Devices start ringing loudly
2. To explode
3. Food or drink is not fresh

- **Sentence:**

1. Despite his alarm going off, he was still sleeping.
2. The milk went off.

# 73. PULL OFF

- **Meaning:**

To succeed in something difficult

- **Sentence:**

I am sure you will pull off this deal.

# 74. PUT OFF

- **Meaning:**

To delay or postpone something

- **Sentence:**

I have this bad habit of putting off things.

Boss put off today's meeting.

# 75. DROP OFF

- **Meaning:**

1. To fall asleep
2. To drop someone somewhere by a car

- **Sentence:**

1. I was dropping off in the class.
2. Would you please drop me off at mom's house?

# 76. COME OFF

- **Meaning:**

1. To give an impression
2. To happen or succeed as planned

- **Sentence:**

- 1. I don't want to come off as an attention seeker.
  2. I tried to make her laugh but couldn't come off.

# 77. TURN OFF

- **Meaning:**

1. To leave the road you are driving on
2. To cause loose interest

- **Sentence:**

1. I turned off the main road early and took the wrong turn.
2. Violence in movies turns me off.



# 78. CUT OFF

- **Meaning:**

1. To remove part of something using a sharp tool
2. Breaking the phone connection

- **Sentence:**

1. Cut off all the small branches.
2. I was talking to him and got cut off.

# 79. CALL OFF

## • Meaning:

1. To cancel
2. To order a dog or someone to stop attacking at someone or something

## • Sentence:

1. Boss called off meeting at the last minute.
2. He was not calling off his dog but was laughing.

# 80. LAY OFF

- **Meaning:**

1. To stop employing someone
2. To stop doing something

- **Sentence:**

1. I was laid off last month.
2. Could you please lay off smoking for a while?
