# §1. TAKE AFTER

- **Meaning:**

To resemble a family or ancestor

- **Sentence:**

My brother is very funny; he takes after our father.

# §2. TAKE ABACK

- **Meaning:**

To surprise or shock someone

- **Sentence:**

1. When I told her my aspirations, she was taken aback.
2. I was taken aback by the result.

# §3. TAKE FOR

- **Meaning:**

To perceive or consider

- **Sentence:**

I look young for my age and people often take me for a teenager.

# §4. TAKE SOMEONE THROUGH SOMETHING

- **Meaning:**

To explain something to someone

- **Sentence:**

Today I am going to take you through my weight loss journey.

# 85. TAKE APART

- **Meaning:**

1. To separate an object into different pieces
2. To show weaknesses of an argument or idea
3. To criticize

- **Sentence:**

1. Why did you take my computer apart?
2. The boss will not approve the report without taking it apart.
3. The critiques took apart the movie but the audience liked it.

# §6. TAKE DOWN

- **Meaning:**

1. To write down an information
2. To dismantle a structure

- **Sentence:**

- 1. Let me take down your contact information.
  2. We have court orders to take down your shop.

# 87. TAKE OVER

- **Meaning:**

To take control of something

- **Sentence:**

1. Nestle took over milk pack Pakistan in 1992.
2. In this country, the Army has taken over three times.

# 88. TAKE UP

- **Meaning:**

1. To start doing something
2. To occupy time or space

- **Sentence:**

1. I am taking up swimming classes from next week.
2. Planning is taking up a lot of time.

# §9. TAKE IN

- **Meaning:**

To understand and remember something

- **Sentence:**

I don't know how much you guys are taking in from this lesson.

# 90. TAKE OUT

- **Meaning:**

To get something officially

- **Sentence:**

I am taking out a loan from the bank for my car.

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
