Of what

Is used to inquire about the object or thing in question.

- We need to figure out of what material this table is made.

Of which

Is used to specify a particular item or items within a group or selection.



Jis main se

- There are many books on the shelf, of which only a few have been read.
- The garden has many flowers, of which roses and tulips are the most abundant.
- He mentioned several cities he had visited, of which Paris was his favorite.

Of whom

Is used to ask about the identity or ownership of a person.



Jin main se

- She talked about her teachers, of whom Mrs. Khan was her favorite.
- He discussed his colleagues, of whom Ali is his closest friend.
- She addressed the audience, of whom many were experts in the field.

4

Of whose

Indicates possession or
association with someone or
something



Jis ka, jin ka

- She found a wallet on the street, of whose owner she was unaware.
- She bought a necklace, of whose design she was fond.
- They moved into a house, of whose garden they were very impressed.

5

Of why

Indicates the reason, cause, or purpose behind something.



Keh kyu

- He couldn't understand the reason of why she was upset.
- We need to explore the root cause of why the project failed.
- She delved into the psychology of why humans behave the way they do.
