

Refers to people (Subject)

Whom

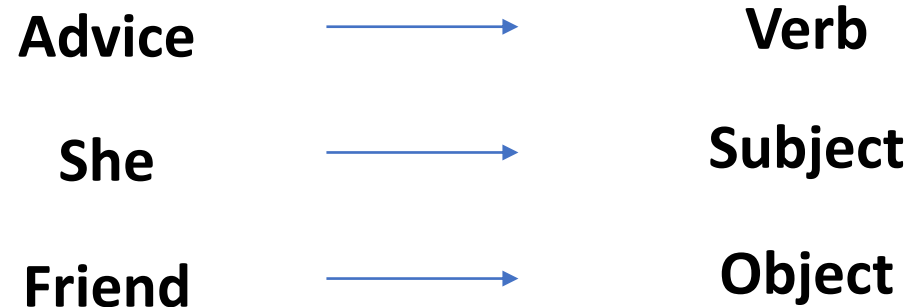
Refers to people (Object)



- The woman whom I met yesterday is a doctor.
- Do you know the person whom I'm talking about?
 - The man whom she hired is very qualified.
